Fourteen non-Samoan members of the congregation were welcomed to the first anniversary service of the Samoan Ministry last Sunday. They really appreciated the fact that the Rev. Fa'amata'u Leota conducted the service in both languages. He told the story of how the ministry began. It took a while—although he commenced ministry in 2017, it was decided by the Samoan members of Hoppers Crossing and Faama to wait for three years to allow a focus on contributing to and strengthening the mission and ministry of the whole congregation as well as broadening their understanding of the UCA. Then one day a visitor asked him whether there was a Samoan service—which he took as a sign that the time was ripe for one to begin. (BL)

WHAT THE UNITING CHURCH HAS SAID:

Informed by our Covenant commitment, and having heard from the UAICC, the Assembly Standing Committee in March 2023 declared its support for the proposed change in the Australian constitution to recognise an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice to Parliament. The Uniting Church sees this referendum as a crucial step toward the full expression of the Uluru Statement from the Heart and its ongoing invitation to seek treaty and truth-telling. In 2009, the Uniting Church endorsed the revised Preamble which changed our own constitution of the Church, a step we felt necessary because it says something about who we are and who we want to become. The referendum gives us a similar opportunity to say something about who we are as a nation by embedding recognition of First Nations people in our national constitution.
