White Sunday

For the Samoan Christian diaspora, White Sunday (or Lotu Tamaiti) is very special. This year at the Uniting Church in Wyndham the celebration is on this Sunday, October 8.

As Tupu Latu explained in last week's news sheet, "The children lead, conduct the service and deliver their messages through their Scripture reciting, singing and dancing."

Samoan White Sunday was probably introduced by 19th century Christian missionaries; its origins are lost in time. It's now celebrated in all Christian churches on Samoa, and the following Monday is a national public holiday.

I asked Site Tupua about his childhood memory of White Sunday. "For about a month the minister would teach a Bible story, and each child from 3 to 16 would learn by heart two or three verses. I can still remember some of them."

Site says: "That's the day when the children take over from the Minister. On White Sunday children are allowed privileges normally reserved for elders; parents will make sure the children are served their favourite dish, which the children eat first and the parents eat last."

I asked Site: "How can Australian Christians prepare for this day?" He responded: "If you wish, you can wear something white." This writer is planning to learn a simple Samoan greeting: "Ta lofa = hello," and to sing along with the Samoan hymns! (NT)

Vote YES says Linda Burney



A supportive audience turned out at the Wungurrwill Dhurrung Community Centre in Communal Road, Wyndham Vale recently to hear Hon. Linda Burney, Federal Minister for Indigenous Australians

put the case for the Yes campaign's Voice to Parliament in the forthcoming referendum.

Everyone present was invited to participate in the smoking ceremony held in the Centre's forecourt.

Joanne Ryan MHR introduced Ms Burney, stating "Before the 1967 referendum, Ms Burney was classified as Australian flora or fauna. Now we can put that shameful history behind us."

Linda Burney called on the audience to reject untruths put out by the "Vote No" camp. She said there are three simple principles involved in voting "Yes." (1) Recognition. A vote for the Voice to parliament brings Australians together as a nation. (2) Listening. First Nations people have significant input into the decision making of this nation. (3) Better outcomes. Aboriginal health, justice and education will improve with a Voice to Parliament.

Ms Burney explained that the referendum needs a double majority, in the six states and two territories of Australia. That is, in four of the six states a majority of voters is required, and a majority of people in the whole country is required.

"There has never before been a question like this one put to Australians. Each person has a role in making history," said Ms Burney.

She said "What we are asking in the referendum is the principle of recognition. The Voice will be independent, accountable, and will be determined by local aboriginal people, with proper representation of regional and remote communities. When we have constitutional reform; when we have power over our destiny, our children will flourish," said Ms Burney. "Contact Yes23 to volunteer for the pre-poll and referendum day." (NT)
