# Book review: Hot Air by Peter Stott

Watching ABC's Four Corners recently I felt depressed, that a group of innocent, naïve climate protestors should take on the power of Australia's fossil fuel industry, hoping to make a difference. It's clear that the combination of politicians and natural gas industry can control the continued flow of massive carbon emissions in Western Australia.



Peter Stott, writer of *Hot Air* documents more than 30 years of struggle by climate scientists to halt the coming disastrous damage to the planet caused by CO<sub>2</sub> emissions.

Stott is a Science Fellow at the UK government's Hadley Centre and Professor in Detection and Attribution at the University of Exeter. He has played a leading role in the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change.

Stott tells of powerful efforts of climate change denialists employed by the fossil fuel industry to prevent action being taken to reduce carbon emissions. He assisted in the preparation of evidence of global warming for the COP 3 conference in Kyoto in 1997. COP reports to the year 2021 show unequivocal evidence of widespread and rapid changes in earth's atmosphere and oceans. Carbon emissions need to be reduced rapidly and reach net zero to prevent global heating reaching catastrophic levels. (NT)
