Gospel reflection today

Recently I joined the Climate choir outside the Arts Centre in St Kilda Road, where we were singing "Here we stand for those who face a rising sea.... Mining fossil fuels is wrong..." (Tune: "She'll be coming round the mountain".) I feel uncomfortable for myself and others active in the 'resist global warming' movement when I know that we are using petrol driven vehicles and natural gas heating and flying with aviation fuel.

How can we reconcile our espoused values with our actions? The writer of Matthew's gospel holds a mirror to see ourselves, when he says in chapter 23, referring to the Pharisees "Obey everything they teach you, but don't do as they do." There's hypocrisy in the Christian church, when it preaches about sin and forgets the decades of documented child sexual abuse in many countries around the world.

The Scribes and Pharisees are castigated in chapter 23 of Matthew's gospel, "You hypocrites..." Let's look at the context.

This gospel was probably written in the decades after the Romans destroyed the Jerusalem Temple in 70CE. The place where this gospel was written was probably an Eastern Mediterranean city such as Antioch in Syria. The Jewish community centred on the synagogue was struggling to recover from the Roman Empire's attack on its religion, its cultural traditions and its priesthood.

Christian Jews who believed in Jesus added to the mix, bringing conflict as new leadership emerged in the Jewish community. The struggle for control of the synagogue was won by the Pharisees, much to the chagrin of the Christian community of Matthew. Therefore, the Gospel of Matthew contains much invective directed at the Pharisees. The church over many centuries directed its hatred toward all Jews.

We Christians today can focus on Matthew's message in verse 12 "humble yourself." And we can live by the command in Micah 6: "Love mercy, do justice and walk humbly with your God." (Neil T)
