Today's amalgamation meetings

Following today's worship service separate congregational meetings will be held to approve the amalgamation of our two congregations which now have been worshipping together since November 2022.

The proposal to be approved is: That this congregation of (Crossroads Werribee/Hoppers Crossing) in accordance with Regulation 3.4.4 request the Presbytery of Port Phillip West to amalgamate this congregation with the (Hoppers Crossing/Crossroads Werribee) congregation as from 2nd December 2023.

The meetings will 'vote' using **consensus decision-making procedures** as approved by the Assembly, in which orange cards are used to show a positive, supportive attitude, and a blue card to show negative or disagreement with the proposal and yellow to ask a clarification question.

Welcome to Melvin T

It's a great pleasure for me to meet a young person from Vanuatu, the former "New Hebrides mission field" of the Australian Presbyterian Church. Over many years I knew former missionaries – including Sister Margery Heard and Revds Milton Chiles, Malcolm Campbell and Alex Peerman.

I learned the story of the famous Presbyterian missionary John G. Paton, who brought the gospel of Jesus to the islanders of the New Hebrides. Paton protested publicly at the slavery practices of the "blackbirders" including Robert Towns, founder of Townsville, who kidnapped young New Hebridean men for unpaid work in the cane fields of Queensland, a black stain on Australia's history.



Melvin T (pictured) is working as a vegetable processor at Werribee South farms. He is attending worship at Crossroads Uniting Church. He greeted me with a big smile and agreed to tell me his story.

He grew up in the village of Erakar on the island of Efate, near to the capital Port Vila, with two brothers and one sister, and attended Onesua Presbyterian College.

Melvin's family attends the Presbyterian Church, and he is a youth leader. Melvin's further education was for a year at the University of the South Pacific, and then at the Maritime College, Port Vila, where he studied towards a Captain's ticket. He says: "I have worked on small merchant ships plying around the islands of Vanuatu. In 2018 I completed firefighting training in Auckland, New Zealand."

He says: "My younger brother came to Australia last year for vegetable farm work, and I became interested. My contract is for 9 months, from my arrival in June this year, until April next year. I share a house in Werribee with several young men from Pacific Islands. Cutting the vegetables starts at 6 am. It's very cold in the mornings."
