Questions re amalgamation meetings

Q: What differences will it make when the two congregations unite? We already worship together.

A: The answer is there will be several important and positive differences even if some things remain the same.

These differences are all positive. We will be able to have just one Church Council, one chairperson, secretary and treasurer, one Property Committee, one set of people responsible for the oversight of the important functions such as occupational health and safety and 'safe church', and of course these roles will be shared amongst a bigger group of members.

Our combined membership will reflect a wider range of ages, interests, strengths and cultures that will enhance our ability to enter more strongly into mission as well as support our existing programs. We will continue to benefit from each other's gifts and strengths in many ways.

There is a financial and property advantage as well. Our combined assets will enable us to undertake valuable improvements to the way we use and develop our property. The last major renovation work to the Crossroads property took place more than 30 years ago and the increased size of the combined congregation necessitates a new look at how the property can be made a better fit for our purposes. The combined finances will also improve the sustainability of our church life, including the provision for ministry. Our ministry needs will be re-evaluated with the guidance of the Presbytery.

Of course, some things will remain much the same, such as worship as one congregation at 9.30am, existing programs such as seniors afternoon tea, boys' brigade, bible discussion groups, and OSLO will continue. The recently re-started Messy Church will continue and the Justice Task Group, which has been strengthened with new members, will continue. The office will continue to be operated, thanks to the volunteers. The combined newsletter will continue, as will the provision of a video of the day's worship service on YouTube and Facebook. (RR)
