Christmas In July service - this week!!!



Valerie grew up in England, the family of six children moved to Australia in 1957. After leaving school she became a librarian. Later moving to Tasmania as Regional Children's Librarian and then Regional Librarian.

Valerie was the first woman in Tasmania to train for the Methodist ministry. After completing her study at Theological Hall in 1975 she was appointed to Kyabram Methodist Circuit with responsibility for five country congregations. Then ordained in October 1975 at Wesley Church Melbourne.

Samoan service

3rd Sunday, 4pm, in the Church: All welcome.

In 1979 she moved to the Hume Highway Parish which stretched from Greenvale to Broadford, when Valerie married Denis Beanland, a Church of Christ Minister. Dennis was working for Church Advisory Services fundraising for the NSW Synod so they spent their "honeymoon" in the Synod offices with accommodation in a church retirement village.

When her daughter Michelle was born in 1982 Valerie took time out from ministry and returned to library work at TAFE and CAE for a time, becoming a Minister in Association at Terang and later in Alice Springs where she also worked with the Public Library and the Central Australian Aboriginal Congress.

In 1992 they returned to Victoria where Valerie provided supply ministry for local congregations while working in libraries at Sandringham, Camberwell and Victoria University Sunbury Campus. 2006 it was time to retire and she and Denis enjoyed two months in New Zealand, then several years travelling around Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria.

Valerie provided supply ministry at Footscray for six weeks that became two years. Other supply positions were at Broadmeadows, Sunshine, Keilor and Werribee plus two years of Intentional Interim Ministry in Tasmania and two years at Glenroy/Pascoe Vale. Currently she is still providing services for Bacchus Marsh, Mount Macedon and Keilor as well as coming to us. Her spare time activities include reading, knitting, sewing, water colour painting and sorting her large collection of stamps and postcards. We thank Valerie for making time for Werribee.
