Seeking a new ministry: a report

Four members of our Joint Nominating Committee met with the Presbytery Pastoral Relations Committee recently to promote our congregation's profile. The PRC highlighted a couple of items that they would like to see changed and we agreed that they do that and forward the profile to Church Council for ratification. In the process, we had to present our case as to why we wanted a

minister either full time or part time. Our response was strong, highlighting the fact they we are a developing congregation with plenty of energy to go forward to being a vibrant congregation in the Wyndham area. We have a youth group that is developing and so we are looking for spiritual leadership to keep this action alive and healthy. Without a spiritual leader encouraging our congregation moving forward it was stated that we may well see a decline in the numbers of the congregation and we would miss a great opportunity developing our diversity, especially with the youth that we have.

There was some discussion about whether we could afford only 0.8 time, but that was before the finance committee took into consideration our investments, and that we could cover any shortfall from income for the first 5 years. So the proposal, with PRC's support, is to seek a full-time minister appointment.

The PRC will now consider the profile and pass back any other comments, and we look forward to the next stage. We do recognise that there may be some time before a minister may become available! (Ken Storey)
