## Musings from Rev. Mark Dunn



Don't you love finding a forgotten ten dollar note in your jacket pocket? Or discovering it's Sunday morning when you thought it was a

working day Monday? Well, how's this: God is gifting us a whole extra day this year with next Thursday being Leap Day 29 February! That means we get a sneaky bonus day in 2024—366 days for the price of 365.

**Why?** One orbit of Earth around the Sun takes 365.2422 days—a little more than our Gregorian calendar's 365. Adding an extra day, aka a leap day, to the calendar every 4 years brings the calendar in line and therefore synchronizes it with the four seasons. The next time it comes around to visit us is Tue 29 Feb 2028 so make the most of it!!

Ages ago, Leap Day was known as Ladies' Day, as it was the one day when women were free to propose to men. In some cultures, it is considered bad luck to get married during a leap year. I don't know of any evidence supporting that theory, but we do know that during leap years: Rome burned (64), the Titanic sank (1912) and COVID-19 struck in 2020—but I don't believe in luck.

During this penitential season of Lent, Christian tradition focuses upon the call and cost of discipleship. Today's gospel (Mk 8) picks up that theme. Jesus makes clear that for those wanting to faithfully follow him, self-denial will be required. *"Those who lose their own life for my sake and for the sake of the gospel, will find it."* v35.

So, I invite you to ask yourself when was the last time you experienced some self-denial? What does your faith cost you in self-sacrifice or inconvenience as you seek to give others some priority over your own wants and needs?

This Lenten season invites us to a fresh repentance, turning from ourselves and our preoccupation with self-concern towards God and the love of neighbour.

May I suggest that you make the most of your leap day and do something very special for someone else with your bonus day. It may just become an ongoing faithful habit.
